


1. Architectural Association Sketch Book: 1909 and 1910; Edited by Gerald C. Horsley, Theodore Fyfe, & W. Curtis Green. London and New York: Architectural Association; Charles Scribner's Sons, 1910. 149 plates, as issued in original wrappers for each of the 8 quarterly parts published in 1909 and 1910, the whole in a portfolio with a green cloth spine and green boards printed in black, with cloth ties. The first quarterly part of each year also contains a leaf bearing an illustrated title page for the year and a leaf bearing an Index, which lists all the plates for the year. The 4 parts for 1909 contain 73 architectural plates (including 2 double-leaf plates, each counted as 2 plates); the 4 parts for 1910 contain 72 plates (3 double-leaf plates, each counted as 2 plates). Remains of paper label at tail of portfolio spine. The plates have been handnumbered in pencil. The wrappers and title leaves have only the London publication information. The plates



were produced by the "Ink Photo" process of Sprague & Co., a London business that pioneered this transfer lithography method to create tone in an image that was similar to the rich detail produced by the collotype method, but cheaper and easier to use. A heavy book; for international shipping, it will have to be sent by priority international. In Very Good Condition: cloth is separating along back joint of portfolio and at head of spine; chipping along edges of wrappers, which have generally separated along folds; fore-edge of 1909 title leaf is heavily chipped, not impacting text or illustration; minor chipping along a few plate edges; other than soiling along edges of some plates, not impacting image, the plates are clean and bright; all 8 parts are complete. In Very Good- Condition: cloth is rubbed and lightly soiled; back board ink stained; ends of spine frayed; front endpaper creased; closed 5-cm. tear from fore-edge of plate no. 27; occasional light soiling in margins. 

Tiffany and other wealthy socially prominent people; the Germantown Cricket Club, Philadelphia; Madison Square Garden (the second by that name); New York State building, Columbian Exposition; Columbia University Library; the New York Herald building; and Sherry's Hotel, New York City, among others. Contains 2 copies of plate 49 (Columbia University Library south elevation). A heavy book; for international shipping, it will have to be sent by priority international. In Good+ Condition: lacking plate 40 (the Washington Arch, New York City, north elevation section); minor loss at some plate corners; occasional edge soiling and chipping; closed tear of 3 cm. from edges of 2 plates; minor staining along edge of 3 plates; lacking back wrapper of part II; wrapper edges are chipped, with small tears; portfolio separated along spine. 



With the original green wrappers, in original green portfolio. Includes residences of William C. Whitney and others; Boston Public Library; University of Virginia; the Cullum Memorial, West Point; the University Club, New York City; the Harvard Union; the Robert Gould Shaw Memorial, Boston; the White House, Washington, D.C., additions and restorations; and St. Bartholomew's Church, New York City. Contains 2 copies of plate 183 (Rhode Island state capitol plans). A heavy book; for international shipping, it will have to be sent by priority international. In Good Condition: lacking plates 108, 125, 127-129, 170, 179, 191, 197 and 198; loss at some plate corners; occasional edge soiling and chipping; closed tear of 4 cm. from edges of 2 plates; minor staining along edge of 1 plate; significant staining along edges of plate 171 (residence of Mrs. Oelrichs, Newport, R.I.), which is heavily soiled; plates 173 and 174 (Oelrichs residence plans and details) are also heavily soiled; lacking back wrapper of part IX; wrapper edges are chipped, with small tears; portfolio partially separated along front joint and lacking ties. 








With the original green wrappers, in replacement portfolio of dark blue cloth. Includes residences of Mrs. W. K. Vanderbilt, Jr., New York City, and others; mausoleums at Woodlawn Cemetery; the Harmonie Club, New York City; library of J. Pierpont Morgan; Madison Square Presbyterian Church; Tiffany & Co.; Belevue Hospital; and additions to the Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York City. A heavy book; for international shipping, it will have to be sent by priority international. In Good Condition: lacking plates 203, 210, 212, 225, 243, 244, 256, 261, 279, 286 and 287; loss at some plate corners; edge soiling and chipping; closed tear of 4 cm. from edges of 2 plates; staining along edge of 3 plates; lacking back wrapper of parts XI and XV; wrapper edges are chipped, with small tears. Includes Pennsylvania Railroad Station, New York City; Columbia University; Girard Trust Co. building, Philadelphia; the Harvard Club, New York City; alterations to the house of Elon H. Hooker, Greenwich, Conn.; American Academy in Rome; Botanical Museum of the Brooklyn Institute of Arts & Science; and the Panama Pacific International Exposition, San Francisco. On the reverse of plate 352 is written in pencil: "Return to Heacock & Hokanson." J. Linden Heacock and Oscar M. Hokanson were architects in Philadelphia from around 1900 to the late 1930s. A heavy book; for international shipping, it will have to be sent by priority international. In Good Condition: lacking plates 337, 341, 354, 385; loss at some plate corners; edge soiling and chipping; staining along edge of 6 plates; lacking back wrapper of part XVI, front wrapper of parts XVII, XVIII, and XX; wrapper edges are chipped, with small tears; portfolio



Six spine compartments between raised bands; gilt-tooled title in second compartments and decoration in remaining


compartments. Without the pages of advertisements often found in this book. Former owner's name on front free endpaper verso: Samuel J. Dornsife. Bookplate on front fixed endpaper indicating that the book belonged to the Victorian Society in America at the Athenaeum of Philadelphia and wa from the Dornsife Collection. This has been stamped: "This book is no longer the property of the Athenaeum of Philadelphia." Pencilled note along gutter of plate no. 43. The only copy we have seen or see reference to that has 102 numbered plates, rather than 100. See Hitchcock 1435-1437, all calling for 100 plates. Samuel J. Dornsife (1916-1999) pioneered authentic restoration and recreation of 19th-century interiors for both houses and museums. In Good Condition: back board detached but present; front board partially detached; lacking leather from tail of spine; boards are rubbed; plates 88-102 reattached by old repair; otherwise, clean and solid; all plates are present. Front wrapper has embossed title over gilt decoration. "120 Principal Views Printed in Colour" -- on front wrapper. Photomechanical reproductions of photographs of historic buildings and memorials in Philadelphia, 5 or 6 per page, with accompanying text. Includes buildings that no longer exist, like the Blue Anchor Inn, formerly at Front and Dock street. Inside the back wrapper is the "Founders' Week" program for Oct. 4-10, 1908. Very scarce. In Very Good-Condition: edges of wrapper are chipped; lacking upper corner of back wrapper; pages are clean and tight. (#006003) \$45.00





Slipcase is in Good+ Condition: edges are rubbed; starting to separate along several joints, but still intact; minor loss at head of spine. Henri Cassiers by Fernand Khnopff -- London Depicted by Tony Grubhoffer -- The Garden at Tigbourne Court, Near Witley, Surrey [designed by Gertrue Jekyll] -- Some Paintings and Sculpture at the London Spring Exhibitions -- The First International Exhibition of Modern Decorative Art at Turin by Dr. Enrico Thovez -- Austrian Section at the Turin Exhibition by A.S. Levetus -- Studio Talk -- Awards in The Studio Prize Competitions -- The Lay Figure: The Tyranny of Exhibitions -- Recent Mural Decorations at Boston. Advertisements on preliminary and final pages. The First International Exhibition of Modern Decorative Art at Turin, Esposizione International d'Arte Decorative Moderna, was the first international exhibition presenting decorative arts alone and was a precursor to the Art Deco movement,




which emerged after World War One. In Good Condition: back wrapper and final leaf of advertisements are detached but present; wrapper is soiled and chipped, and partially lacking over spine; internally clean and solid. (#005941) \$45.00

Group of Perry Pictures materials consisting of: 4 sepia photographs (13 x 9.5 cm.) produced by the Taber Prang Art Co., Springfield, Mass., 2 captioned "Cupid Awake" and 2 captioned "Cupid Asleep." one of which is stamped on the back "Compliments of the Perry Pictures Company"; 3 undated catalogs of Perry Pictures; 133 Perry Pictures consisting of European and American scenes, portraits of famous people, and famous paintings; 1 typed order for pictures, dated 1926; 1 packing slip from Perry Picture dated 1948; and 6 envelopes containing Perry Pictures addressed to Joseph Z. As with many of the titles Foulis published, this was issued more than once. Copies issued between 1913 and 1917 had a publisher's catalog including a series list on pp. [45-46] and listed the printer on p. [46]. In this copy the final leaf (pp. [45-46]) is blank, suggesting that this was an earlier publication. A 1910 edition has illustrated endpapers. Label on blank leaf following front endpapers and on back fixed endpaper for C.M. Darling Art Shop, Scranton, Pa. In Fine Condition: clean and bright. (#005955) \$85.00

Publisher's dark brown cloth with gilt-stamped cover title and decoration. No date of publication. Little is known about the publisher Maler Renz, but it was active in the mid-19th century. This title is not in WorldCat. The title page verso contains a poem by German poet Albert Knapp (1798-1864). Very scarce. In Fair Condition: cover is rubbed and slightly soiled; lacking number 9 and 2/3 of number 10; numbers 30 and 32 are detached but present, with chipping along fore-edges; number 34 lacking lower corner, without loss of illustration or caption; numerous closed tears; finger soiling throughout. 

This work by Mennonite Heinrich Funck was first published in Germantown, Pa., in 1744. Johann M. Schünemann was active in the 1850s in Skippack, Pa., (known variously as Schippach or Skippackville at the time), printing for the German-speaking Mennonite and Schwenckfelder communities. His edition of Funck's work on baptism is very scarce. In Good Condition: cover is soiled and dampstained; small loss at upper edge of each free endpaper; faint dampstain throughout, primarily at ends of gutter; foxing thorughout; otherwise, clean and tight. 



Notes on front endpapers: "Presented by Mrs. Dr. Wm. Speer Nov. 3, 1904" and "Rebound Nov. 1955." Occasional pencilled marginal notes; one folded leaf bound at the end with additional pencil notations. The Rev. William Speer (1822-1904) was a missionary in China; in 1853 with his wife, Elizabeth Ewing Speer (d. 1910), he helped to found the Presbyterian Church in Chinatown, San Francisco. In Near Fine- Condition: old stain on pp. 31-32; occasional minor foxing; pencilled notations; otherwise, clean and tight. (#005982) \$125.00

Publisher's catalog on 8 pages following text, dated Dec. 1879. Gift inscription on front free endpaper: "To Charles E. Dickson from Mama Dec. 24th 1880." The story of a slave from Jamaica who saves the child in his care at the cost of his own life. In Very Good- Condition: ends of spine are frayed and cloth over spine is torn; purple has faded from spine and front cover; front free endpaper detached but present; otherwise, clean and solid.
